RE: Tariffs Response – City of Courtenay Joins Team Canada

Thank you for sharing Courtenay Council's resolution on the City's actions in response to United States tariffs on Canadian goods. We wanted to add the Village's support for the City's position and actions to engage with local business organizations.

The City's position aligns with the Village's social procurement practices and values of purchasing locally where possible. Cumberland Council is supportive the City's efforts to prioritize Canadian-made goods and services where possible. Along the same lines, the Village adopted a social procurement framework some time ago to leverage public dollars and achieve desirable and targeted social impact for the Village through competitive bid and purchasing activities.
