Calls for Service

In the fourth quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, there was an 11.6 percent (397 file) decrease in the number of Calls for Service in Courtenay relative to the fourth quarter of the previous fiscal year.

Relative to the fourth quarter of the previous fiscal year, there were notable decreases in Calls for Service for Unwanted Person as well as Check Wellbeing and there was a notable increase in Calls for Service for Breach.

Most Common Call Locations (Excluding RCMP Detachment)

In the fourth quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, relative to the previous fiscal year, there were notable increases in Calls for Service at the Provincial Courthouse, The Junction, and the Crown Isle Shopping Plaza. There was a 41-precent decrease in Calls for Service at the Connect Warming Centre. In the fourth quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year:

- Calls for Service at the Provincial Courthouse were predominantly related to Breach;
- Over half the Calls for Service at The Junction pertained to Unwanted Person, Missing Person, Check Wellbeing, Assist Police/Fire/Ambulance, and Theft; and
- Over half the Calls for Service at the Crown Isle Shopping Plaza pertained to Unwanted Person, Theft, Traffic Incident, and Check Wellbeing.

Most Common Downtown Calls for Service

In Downtown Courtenay, the number of Calls for Service the fourth quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year (746) decreased by 17 percent from the number of Calls for Service the fourth quarter of the previous fiscal year (894). In the fourth quarter of the 2024-2025, there was a notable decrease in Calls for Service pertaining to Unwanted Person and a notable increase in Calls for Service pertaining to Breach relative to the fourth quarter of the previous fiscal year.


Types of Violent Crime


Types of Property Crime
